



The Oregon Crime Victims Law Center is very pleased to announce that Megan Johnson and Senator Richard Devlin have joined its Board of Directors. Ms. Johnson is an attorney practicing civil litigation, and does personal injury work on behalf of children, older adults, and those with disabilities. Ms. Johnson spent 17 years as a prosecutor and has tried more than 180 cases involving child abuse and protection of the elder and disabled populations. Ms. Johnson's extensive knowledge of criminal practice is an asset to crime victims who need assistance navigating and accessing the criminal and civil justice system.

Senator Devlin began his political career in 1996 when he was elected to the Oregon House of Representatives. He later served in the Oregon Senate from 2002 to 2018, representing the 19th Senate district. While in office Senator Devlin was appointed to the Joint Ways and Means Committee and chaired subcommittees on education and natural resources. From 2007 to 2010 he was the Majority Leader of the Senate. He then was appointed Co-Chair of Ways and Means, a position he held until he was appointed to the Northwest Power and Conservation Council by Governor Kate Brown in January 2018. Senator Devlin had previously worked in adult and juvenile corrections and in civil and criminal investigations.
